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Aldenham Prep School was first established in the year 2000 in some of our existing buildings. It has become a popular, nurturing environment for our younger pupils. Boys and girls have enjoyed their early years learning based on Aldenham's strong family values.

Enthusiastic parents who had chosen the nursery at Aldenham for their children persuaded the Governors to convert one wing of Wilson House, the former Sanitorium, into classrooms. This provided room for a Reception class and for the Prep School to begin.

The Nursery and Pre-Prep expanded by one form each year and in 2003 the children were ready to move on to the next stage in their preparatory education. In order to accommodate them, the building initially used by the Senior School for eleven plus entrants, Martineau's House, was transformed to create a space for the Prep School. The building was renamed Woodrow House and the Aldenham Prep School was complete.

"The greatest thing about school so far has been the trips and residentials; we went to France and practised speaking French. I like English and am good at creative writing."

Archie is Head Boy at Aldenham Prep School and looking forward to following his brother into the Senior School.





Children have thrived in the warm and friendly environment, with a strong all-inclusive ethos that provides a sound foundation for boys and girls. Yet, until now that has been provided in buildings which were not built for primary years pupils and do not link together to form a whole entity.

In 2021, when the Vincent Building is completed, Woodrow House will be returned to the Senior School creating a second House for our eleven to thirteen year olds.

# Remembering Dick Vincent OA



Lord Vincent, known to many as Dick, had an enduring relationship with Aldenham. On leaving the School in 1950 he joined the British Army to become a full-time soldier with the Royal Artillery. His military career spanned 46 years and on his retirement as Chairman of the NATO Military Committee, in 1996, he was ennobled in the Birthday Honours, being created a life peer, with the title Baron Vincent of Coleshill. He became Chancellor of Cranfield University and for many years Dick was a Governor of Aldenham School and eventually made an Emeritus Governor. He was also an inspirational Past President of the OA Society. Dick died in 2018 and the Vincent Building will be a lasting memorial to him, which we hope will serve as inspiration to the children who are lucky enough to learn there.







The Aldenham Foundation is committed to providing a brand new building for its younger children and this major development will be fully funded. In order to enhance the learning environment and in particular the outdoor space we will be looking for help.

We want to create the most attractive grounds, in keeping with the whole Aldenham site. There will be a multi use games area (MUGA), an amphitheatre and a wildlife area including a pond.

The children love to be outside and we know that spending time in nature is proven to have a positive effect on academic performance as well as improving concentration, confidence and a feeling of wellbeing. A yurt and a tepee in the School grounds will offer year round facilities for developing curiosity, creativity and connectedness - the foundations of learning.

"My favourite subject is Maths especially challenging fellow pupils to a times tables duel on the iPads. The new building looks amazing and I will come back to see my teachers, they are the best!"

Alexander is the proud nephew of an OA, Dr Nick Schindler (K1998 2005). He is moving on from Aldenham Prep to the Senior School in September 2020.





On Button Field we plan to provide a pavilion for shelter, refreshments, indoor play and much more. There will be seating for spectators and for picnics.

The Vincent Building will provide an ideal modern facility, with its own Hall that will accommodate the whole school for assemblies and events. There will be 100 retractable seats that will turn the Hall into a mini theatre.

"My time at the Prep School instilled me with confidence. I have made friendships for life and I know that I'll be welcome back at Aldenham, it's part of my family."

Sarah is the third in her family to come to Aldenham. She joined the Prep School at the age of 8 when her brother and sister were in the Senior School.







Specialist classrooms will include a Science Laboratory, Computing Room, Creativity Room for art, pottery and technology. There will also be a Drama and Music Studio with three practice rooms.

The new Prep School will also have its own Library and dining area, essentials that previous pupils have had to share with the Senior School. Children will continue to enjoy a close relationship with the Senior School and will have the benefit of using the main School Theatre and participating in master classes in various subjects.

The Senior School will accommodate around 100 more pupils in Woodrow House for 11-13 year olds.

New facilities will be provided in the Senior School for Art, Computing, Design and Technology and the Sciences.

The Schools in the Aldenham Foundation will continue to share a reputation for excellence in academic achievement as well as creative areas and sports.
